Company exploring using bats as pest control

Method could help eliminate mosquito problem at work site

Benson Environmental is investigating a pest control method that might seem a little unconven-

tional, but in some places has proven to be an effective solution.

Brian Benson, general manager of the tire transport and disposal company, addressed the Webster

Parish Police Jury in its committee meeting about ways to combat a growing mosquito population at the site. He says he's researched two methods - thermal fogging, which uses two different chemicals to kill mosquitoes and the bat houses.

"We have been researching this on what

would be best for us and best for you," he said, speaking to police jury members. "We kind of came to the conclusion that general fogging and throwing chemicals into the air and hoping to hit something was not the best idea. So, we went back to our (pest) control company and asked them,

'What have you got?' 'Everything in your arsenal, what have you got?'"

He went on to explain the logistics of thermal fogging. It's similar to regular fogging, except that it's handheld and has two chemicals that are used. One is an on-contact pesticide and the other chemi-

Forgery, theft charges lead to Minden man's arrest

Police: Suspect confessed to stealing checks, debit card

A Minden man walking in the middle of the street found himself in handcuffs after police found items on him that did not belong to him.

Daniel Merritt, 19, of the 100 block of Milton Drive, was arrested Tuesday, June 2, and charged with theft, illegal possession of stolen things, forgery and possession of drug paraphernalia. Bond was set at \$13,700.

Minden Police Chief Steve Cropper says Officer First Class Clint Smith and Officer Jamie Franklin were running routine patrol, and when on Landing Street, they observed a male walking down the middle of the street.

"It kind of threw a red flag up for the officers, so they made contact with him," he said. "They asked him who he was and asked him for identification. He (Merritt) indicated he didn't have any identification."

Officers then asked for permission to search his person for identification, Cropper says, at which time he gave consent. At that time, the officers pulled Merritt's wallet out, and when the wallet was opened, they found a debit card in someone else's name and two checks.

"One of those checks were made out to and signed by Mr. Merritt," the chief said. "Neither the checks nor the debit card belonged to him. At that point in time, they asked him questions about the debit card and he admitted he'd stolen both."

Cropper clarified Merritt made the check out to himself

2015 FLOOD

Jindal to tour area to view high water

SHREVEPORT — Gov. Bobby Jindal is traveling to northwest Louisiana to get a firsthand look at the rising waters of the Red River. The governor will be in Caddo and Bossier parishes Friday.

Meteorologist Mario

Valverde says data indicates the crest is likely to hit 35.5 feet Saturday. That's still under the 70-year mark of 38.3 feet set in April 1945.

Jindal says the state has deployed more than 255,000 sandbags to areas prone to flood waters, and approximately 650,000 more are on standby.

Bossier Parish Sheriff Julian Whittington says the Cash Point RV Park has been evacuated and the River Bluff subdivision is in damage of flooding.

In Caddo Parish, several homes near Twelve Mile Bayou have flooded and sections of several streets near the river are covered with water.

A thank you to four La. legislators

Thanks to legislation approved Monday, Louisiana's next governor will be able to access billions of available federal dollars desperately needed for health care as the state faces a \$1.6 billion budget disaster. Sponsored by Republican House Speaker Chuck Kleckley and crafted by the Louisiana Hospital Association, House Concurrent Resolution 75 is crucial for helping to fill the funding gap. Essentially, this measure will let private hospitals pool their dollars to pay Louisiana's share of Medicaid expansion. In turn, the new infusion of federal money would compensate the hospitals for the expense of caring for the vast numbers of poor people who show up in their emergency rooms. According to Kleckley, R-Lake Charles, the state stands to save \$100 million to \$200 million a year on health care expenses that could be covered through the federal funds and this money could be shifted to other areas.

Gov. Bobby Jindal has opposed Medicaid expansion as being too costly for Louisiana and as being an inappropriate expansion of federal health care. His position hurts the estimated 17 percent of the state's population who are uninsured, and it hurts the hospitals who have to absorb the hefty cost of caring for them.

However, Governor Jindal cannot veto HCR 75, and Louisiana's next governor, who will be elected this fall, will have until April 2016 to make a decision. The hospitals' willingness to help pay the state's share of the expansion will make it easier for the next governor to say yes.

All four of the major candidates for governor -- state Rep. John Bel Edwards, D-Amite, and Republicans U.S. Sen David Vitter, Public Service Commissioner Scott Angelle and Lt. Gov. Jay Dardenne -- have indicated they support some form of Medicaid expansion. The three Republicans have said they would like getting the federal dollars if they can have more control over how it's spent.

HCR 75 attracted bipartisan support in the Legislature. Many, but not all, of Tangipahoa Parish's delegation voted for it. Among them are Edwards, D-Amite, who has been a leader on this issue throughout the session. Also voting yes were Rep. Chris Broadwater, R-Hammond; Rep. Steve Pugh, R-Ponchatoula; and Sen. Ben Nevers, D-Bogalusa, who had repeatedly pushed for Medicaid expansion.

Eight senators from this area voted against HCR 75. They are Bodi White, R-Baton Rouge, who represents Hammond; Jack Donahue, R-Mandeville; and Dale Erdey, R-Liveston. Meanwhile, Reps. Sherman Mack, R-Albany, and Scott Simon, R-Abita Springs, did not vote.

Senator Nevers told The Associated Press, "At least it gives us some opportunity for the future."

HCR 75 is a smart, common-sense move on the part of the Legislature and the hospitals. If the next governor chooses to employ it -- and it's hard to imagine that he will not -- this measure will help provide some much-needed, long-term budget stability to Louisiana and will protect access to quality health care for everyone.

Thank you, legislators Broadwater, Edwards, Nevers and Pugh.

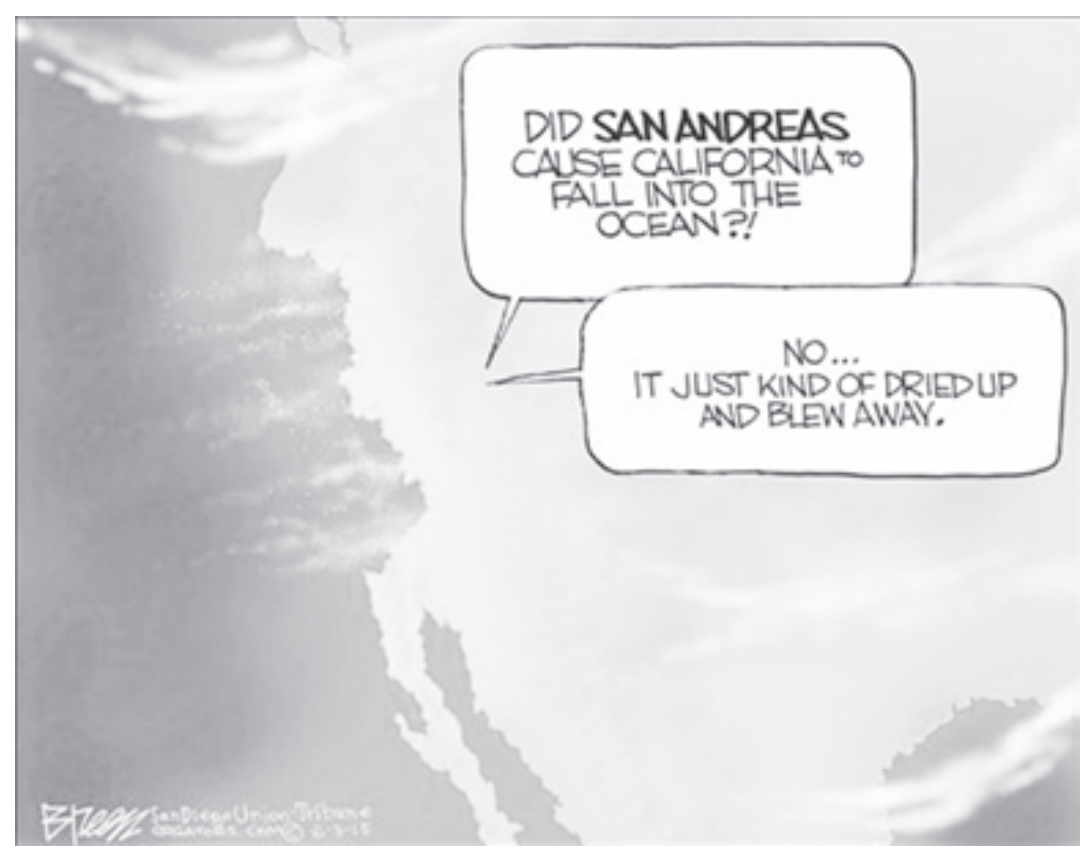

A tale of three cities

Charles Dickens himself would be perplexed and depressed by what's going on in some American metropolises. It is not the squalor that he chronicled in England, but young men wantonly killing each another.

Meanwhile, many of our elites look around for someone to blame and point at the men and women who police these concrete killing fields.

There are scores of cities and towns where violence is getting worse. But the dire state of urban America can be summarized by what's going on in three large and famous cities.

New York City, in addition to being the nation's financial and media capital, was also the poster city for a miracle in crime reduction. There were more than 2,000 yearly killings not long ago, during the dreaded "Dinkins Years," named for famously feckless Mayor David Dinkins. Good ol' Dave was as liberal and as clueless as they come; he basically threw his hands up and went out to play a few sets of tennis.

Many in the pundit class considered Gotham just plain ungovernable, at least until Rudy Giuliani and Michael Bloomberg proved otherwise. Over their two decades, those 2,000 murders dwindled to about 300. A stunning achievement, and one that saved thousands of lives, almost all of them black lives.

So what did New Yorkers do? In 2013, their city pacified by Giuliani and Bloomberg, elected Bill de Blasio, a guy who's about as far left as they come, and who kisses the ring of Al Sharpton. It's probably a ring designed by one of those Jewish "diamond mer-

chants" Sharpton slandered in one of his notorious violence-fomenting episodes.

One of Mayor de Blasio's first priorities was dismantling the 'stop-and-frisk' procedure that removed thousands of guns from the streets.

The results? Unfortunate and entirely predictable.

Murders are up about 20% this year. For the first time in two decades, shootings have increased for two straight years. You might say Mayor de Blasio had a dream, and poor New Yorkers are paying a steep price.

Fortunately for Chicagoans, the Second City has a boss who makes de Blasio look like Harry Callahan. Still, under Mayor Rahm Emanuel's watch, shootings and homicides are at a five-year high. The city is averaging more than a murder a day, and May was an especially cruel month.

99 years ago the poet Carl Sandburg wrote his epic salute to Chicago, which he called the "City of the Big Shoulders." He issued this dare to the world: "Show me another city with lifted head singing so proud to be alive and coarse and strong and cunning."

Sandburg's city is now run by operatives like Rahm Emanuel. After an especially brutal Memorial Day weekend, during which a dozen Chicagoans were murdered, Mayor Emanuel proclaimed that his city really needs stricter gun control. Ask a liberal a question about crime, any question, and that is the answer that comes right back. Go ahead, try it.

And then there is Baltimore, a city where public safety is declining even faster than its people are fleeing. More than 40 people were shot to death in May, the city's most violent month since the 70s, back when Baltimore had 200,000 more residents.

As an aside, there's an interesting tale behind Baltimore's nickname. The moniker "Charm City"

was conjured up by some ad executives in 1975 because the mayor was concerned about the city's image.

One has to wonder, what would those advertising geniuses come up with today? Perhaps "Armed City" would be accurate, but it might not attract tourists to the Inner Harbor.

Republicans quickly and gleefully point out that New York, Chicago, and Baltimore - like pretty much every other big city - are firmly in the grip of liberal Democrats. And that New York's miracle occurred under Republican mayors. But to be fair, there were simultaneous crime declines in Democratic cities.

It's not party affiliation - it's a mindset that says criminals must pay dearly for their crimes, that cops perform works of heroism every day, and that the men and women in blue are the only thing standing between civilization and barbarity.

That ideology, a victim of its own success, is now being shunted aside. Instead, we have politicians lamenting "mass incarceration," and rabble-rousers accusing cops of all kinds of heinous acts. This is a recipe for mayhem, and it's being cooked up right now in front of our eyes.

The Big Apple, Charm City, The City of the Big Shoulders. They are still filled with hard-working people who love this country, obey its laws and respect the cops.

But at the moment these great cities are led by scallywags and scoundrels, men and women who are the antithesis of problem-solvers.

Yes, things can change in cities across America. But only if those good citizens channel Howard Beale and finally say they are mad as Hell and just aren't going to take it anymore.

NBA Warriors win another thriller

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — James Harden had Game 2 on his fingertips — and then he didn't.

Now the Golden State Warriors have the Western Conference finals in their grasp.

Stephen Curry scored 33 points before Harden lost the ball in the closing seconds to end a spectacular duel between the NBA MVP and runner-up, and the Warriors held off the Houston Rockets 99-98 on Thursday night to take a 2-0 lead in the series.

"Sometimes I want to crack open a beer and get a courtside seat. These two guys are the two best basketball players in the world," Warriors center Andrew Bogut said.

Harden rallied the Rockets from 17 points down in the second quarter and had a chance to finish off the comeback in the fourth. Instead, Klay Thompson and Curry trapped Harden, who lost the ball as time expired.

Harden fell to the floor and put his hands over his head as the Warriors celebrated on the court, the sell-out crowd of 19,596 roared, and golden-yellow confetti fell from the rafters.

"Kicking chairs," Harden said. "It's frustrating. It's frustrating to give the game away like that."

Harden had 38 points, 10 rebounds and nine assists, and Dwight Howard overcame a sprained left knee that slowed him down to finish with 19 points and 17 rebounds for a Rockets team headed home in a major hole.

Game 3 is Saturday in Houston, which is facing a two-game deficit again. The Rockets overcame a 3-1 hole in the second round against the Los Angeles Clippers.

NHL Ducks rebound to win game 3

CHICAGO (AP) — Anaheim coach Bruce Boudreau knew the answer without having to ask the question.

Any doubts he had about fatigue and his squad's ability to bounce back after a disheartening loss in triple overtime less than 48 hours earlier disappeared even before the midday shoot-around.

"Nobody mentioned anything," Boudreau said after the Ducks' 2-1 victory over the Blackhawks on Thursday night, "because they all wanted to play."

Good thing, too, because goaltender Frederik Andersen and the Anaheim back line were tested repeatedly while killing off five Chicago power plays to take a 2-1 lead in the Western Conference finals. Andersen made 27 saves, but nearly as important, the players in front of him combined to block 27 shots, compared to just nine blocks for the Blackhawks.

Chicago also had precious few good scoring chances to show for a combined 9:18 of power-play opportunities.

"Those guys want to get through the neutral zone and come with speed," Anaheim's Andrew Coglian said. "They want to pick you apart. I think guys had really good sticks in the neutral zone tonight."

LSU into SEC semi's



HOOVER, Ala. — Top-ranked LSU advanced to the SEC Tournament semifinal for the third straight year Thursday night as the Tigers posted a 10-5 win over No. 20 Arkansas at Hoover Metropolitan Stadium.

LSU (48-9), which has won five of the previous seven SEC Tournament championships and two in a row, will play either Florida or Arkansas in the semifinals on Saturday afternoon. The game will begin 30 minutes after the conclusion of the Noon semifinal game on Saturday between Texas A&M and either Alabama

or Vanderbilt. Thursday's win marked LSU's ninth straight victory in an SEC Tournament game, dating back to 2013.

Arkansas dropped to 35-21 with Thursday's loss and will face Florida on Friday evening in an elimination contest.

LSU capitalized on six errors committed by Arkansas in Thursday's game, including three miscues in the first inning as the Tigers seized a 4-0 lead.

"I think Arkansas' errors were the result of the pressure that we put

on them," said LSU coach Paul Mainieri. "We put a lot of pressure on them with our speed and the running game. I thought our team's speed and our bat-handling ability were big factors early in the game. We put pressure on them, they made some mistakes, and we took advantage of them."

LSU scored four runs in the top of the first inning against Arkansas starter James Teague. Third baseman Conner Hale lifted a sacrifice fly and first baseman Chris Chinea lined an RBI single to highlight the outburst for the Tigers, who also stole two bases and took advantage of a wild pitchh and three Arkansas errors in the frame.

The Tigers extended the lead to 6-0 in the second as rightfielder Mark

Laird ripped an RBI double and shortstop Alex Bregman delivered an run-scoring single.

Arkansas narrowed the deficit to 6-4 in the second against LSU starter Austin Bain as shortstop Michael Bernal, first baseman Clark Eagan and leftfielder Joe Serrano each lined RBI singles, and another run scored on a Bain wild pitch.

LSU reliever Russell Reynolds took over for Bain in the second with two outs and a runner at first, and he retired Arkansas centerfielder Andrew Benintendi, the SEC Player of the Year, on a fly ball to left field.

Reynolds (6-0) was brilliant in relief, working 3.1 shutout innings and allowing just two hits with no walks and three strikeouts.

Teague (4-4) was

charge with the loss as he surrendered six runs — two earned — on six hits in two innings with one walk and no strikeouts.

The Tigers scored two runs in the fourth against Arkansas reliever Jackson Lowery as leftfielder Jake Fraley slapped a run-scoring single and Bregman contributed a sacrifice fly.

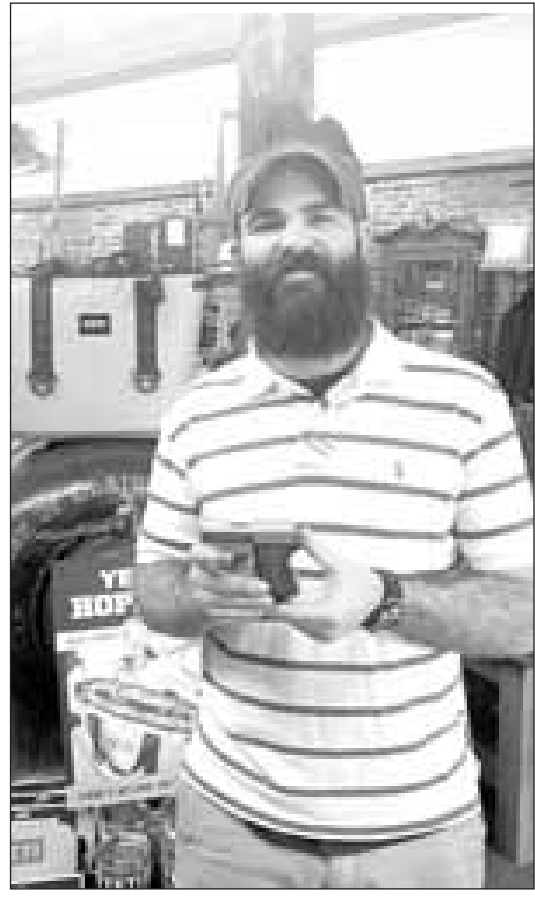
Bregman lifted another sacrifice fly in the seventh and centerfielder Andrew Stevenson added a two-out RBI single to give the Tigers a 10-4 advantage.

Arkansas plated a run in the bottom of the seventh rightfielder Tyler Spoon lined a run-scoring single.

Bregman finished 1-for-2 at the plate with three RBI, and second baseman Jared Foster collected three hits and scored two runs to pace the Tigers' 12-hit attack.

Graydon Carter knew Caitlyn Jenner's cover would be popular, but this popular? That was a surprise.

"I knew it would be a thing. I had no idea how big a thing it would be. We decided to work with the Internet rather than just complain about the Internet as a monthly magazine, and it turned out to be amazing," the Vanity Fair editor said Thursday while seated front row at a Gucci cruisewear fashion show.

By "working," Carter meant the magazine's choice to release the cover on social media and simultaneously offer prospective readers the chance to buy the article on iTunes for \$4.99.

Jenner's Old Hollywood style in a creamy corset for the cover and classic gowns in gold sequins and black were important statements

for her, said Jessica Diehl, the magazine's fashion and style director who also attended the Gucci show. And Jenner — formerly Bruce — was definitely in charge when it came to her debut in the photos shot by Annie Leibovitz.

"I think it was very important for her to come out in a very iconic, timeless but very open way," Diehl said.

Did Diehl, who has styled numerous covers for the magazine, find herself managing Jenner's nerves?

"I think the relief she feels overcomes any nervousness," Diehl said.

The shoot required unprecedented security for the magazine. Diehl hunted for looks incognito in stores.

"We did absolutely nothing digital. Normally we would send pictures to each other but everything was completely offline."

Has Diehl been in the business too long to be moved by the overwhelming attention for Jenner and the cover shoot?

"Not at all," the stylist said. "She's very inspiring."
