

Nerves & uncertainty, but hope, reign for 2022 season

There is always a lot of uncertainty before a new season and 2022 is no exception.

Of course, the major uncertainty involves the postseason — specifically, what it will look like as many teams in the LHSAA have moved from non-select to select status.

The plan for the playoffs hadn't been decided at presstime for this publication. Of course, we have to get through the 10-week regular season first.

The six Bossier Parish teams had mixed results last season. Parkway and Benton had very good seasons. Bossier also had a solid year under firstyear Head Coach De'Aumante Johnson.

Haughton went .500 in the regular season but as a whole the season fell short of the success of recent teams. Airline had an uncharacteristic bad season. Plain Dealing struggled for the most part. There are two new head coaches. Justin Scogin has replaced Bo Meeks at Airline. Clint Walker has replaced Christopher Wilson at Plain Dealing.

Both face big challenges.

Scogin will be trying to rebuild confidence in a team that went 1-9 last year. Walker will face the same small roster issues his predecessors had to deal with.

In District 1-5A, none of the four parish teams will be favored to win the title. But it won't be a surprise if one does.

Parkway and Benton seem the most likely candidates. Haughton could be in the mix too. And despite last season, there is no way you can count Airline out.

> Byrd and Captain Shreve, who shared the title last year, are the favorites again.

There is plenty of talent among the 5A parish schools. Haughton's Colin Rains and Benton's Gray Walters are back for their third year as starting quarterbacks.

Parkway is led by one of the state's best — and fastest — running backs in Jaylan White. Benton running back Greg Manning is coming off a sensational sophomore season.

Benton also has one of the top receivers in the area in Pearce Russell.

Tigers linebacker Zach Halbert was the All-Parish Defensive MVP last season. Parkway end Ray Mayweather and linebacker Barrett Newman are among the other candidates for that honor this season.

And that's just a few of the notable returnees. For the rest, see the team preview pages later in this section.

Bossier makes the jump from District 1-3A to 1-4A. It will be a challenge playing the likes of Huntington, Northwood and North DeSoto. But Johnson is the type of coach that welcomes a challenge.

Bossier was hit hard by graduation, but you can expect the Bearkats to be competitive at the very least.

As mentioned earlier, Plain Dealing's Walker has the difficult task of managing a small roster of players.

But there are some talented athletes among those. And the Lions' schedule is not as strong as last season so the potential for success is there.

Yes, there are plenty of uncertainties going into the season. But one thing is for certain. It will be fun to watch it play out.

WEEK 1

Northwood at Benton

Benton pulled out a 12-7 victory last season. The game should feature a matchup between two of the area's best quarterbacks in Benton's Gray Walters and Northwood's Mason Welch.

Airline at North DeSoto

This game marks the debut of Airline Head Coach Justin Scogin. The Vikings are coming off a 1-9 season, so they will want to get off to a good start. They will be facing a team that will likely be a strong contender for the District 1-4 title.

WEEK 2

Glenbrook at Bossier

The Apaches return most of the players off last season's 8-2 team. As a first-year member of the LHSAA, Glenbrook was ineligible for the playoffs. Coach David Feaster's team is looking for big things this season.

Benton at Newman

Benton will travel more than 300 miles to face Newman, a Class 1A school, and quarterback Arch Manning, a Texas commit. Manning, nephew of Peyton and Archie, is generally considered the No. 1 QB prospect in the nation.

WEEK 3

Bossier at Parkway

The Bearkats and Panthers haven't faced off since 2010, when both were in District 1-4A. This is the final non-district game for both teams.

WEEK 4

Parkway at Haughton

This is the third matchup between the Brotherton brothers. Parkway won 17-3 last season, giving Parkway Head Coach Coy Brotherton his first win over brother Jason. The series between the two stands at one win apiece. More importantly, it's a District 1-5A opener.



WEEK 5

Captain Shreve at Parkway

This game should go a long way toward deciding the district championship. The teams split games last season. The Gators won 46-21 in the regular season. The Panthers pulled off an upset in the second round of the playoffs, winning 30-23.

Haynesville at Plain Dealing

The Lions take on perennial Class 1A power Haynesville.

Byrd at Benton

The Yellow Jackets routed the Tigers 45-17 last season en route to a share of the district title. The game will likely have a big impact on the district race.

WEEK 6

Airline vs. Captain Shreve (Lee Hedges Stadium)

Captain Shreve won 33-0 in the regular-season finale last year. Airline will like be the underdog, but the Vikings will be looking to prove they are back among the district's elite teams.

WEEK 7

Byrd at Parkway

It won't be a big surprise if this game turns out deciding the district championship. The Yellow Jackets won 35-24 last season. The offense played well, but like other teams in the district the Panthers couldn't contain Byrd's veer option.

WEEK 8

Benton at Haughton

Benton had one of its most impressive offensive performances of the season in last year's 42-21 victory. It could be another high-scoring game.

WEEK 9

Glenbrook at Plain Dealing

Head Coach David Feaster's Apaches make their second trip to Bossier Parish. It will be interesting to see how Plain Dealing has progressed under its new head coach.

Parkway at Airline

If Airline is able to pull off some upsets, this game could have a big impact on the district race. The Panthers won 34-17 last season.

Captain Shreve at Benton

Captain Shreve won 48-35 last season. Trailing by 21 in the third quarter, the Tigers got within six with about three minutes to play. This is another game that will likely have a big impact on the district race.

WEEK 10

Benton at Parkway

Last year the teams met in a district opener in Week 4. In one of the best games of the year, Parkway rallied for a 30-23 victory.

Bossier vs. Huntington (Independence Stadium)

If Bossier pulls off some upsets, this game could impact the District 1-4A race. The Raiders are one of the favorites to win the title and will likely have a very good record.

For the first time since 2018, there will be a new champion in District 1-1A.

Calvary Baptist, which didn't lose a district game in three seasons, has moved up to District 1-2A.

With Lincoln Prep moving to District 2-1A, the district is down to seven teams. Despite Calvary's departure, the district remains one of the strongest in Class 1A.

The Homer Pelicans finished runner-up last season, losing only to Calvary, and went on to win the Class 1A state championship. It was the school's first state title since 1939.

The Haynesville Golden Tornado, who have won 17 state championships, reached the semifinals last season, falling to Homer 40-0. As a first-year member of the

LHSAA, Glenbrook was ineligible for the playoffs, but the Apaches made their presence felt in the regular season, going 8-2.

Glenbrook defeated Haynesville 42-41 in a game that decided third place in the district.

Homer must replace quarterback Te'Keviuntae Kidd, the MVP in Homer's 41-28 victory over Logansport in the state championship game. But the Pelicans, who were 11-3 last season, are still one of the favorites to take the district title.

Two LSWA first-team All-State selections — running back Ely'jay Curry and offensive lineman Davion Champ — are back.

Curry rushed for 1,662 vards on 134 carries and scored 20 touchdowns last season. Head Coach Richie Casev also has his secondand third-leading rushers back in Gregory Williams and Andrevious Buggs.

Glenbrook returns eight players who made first- or second-team All-District last season.

Maddox Mandino was a first-team selection at linebacker and athlete on offense.

Other first-team selections returning are wide receiver Turner McClelland and linebacker Hayden Harmon. Quarterback Ty Feaster is back. He will also handle placekicking duties again.

All told, Head Coach David Feaster returns 10 starters on offense and nine on defense.

Plain Dealing has a new head coach. Clint Walker takes over for Christopher Wilson, now an assistant coach at North DeSoto.

District 1-4A has a new look this season

Last year, the 10 teams divided into two five-team divisions dubbed District 1 and District 2 with each crowning a champion. This year, the district is down to eight teams with a seven-game district schedule.

The teams are Bossier, Northwood, Evangel Christian, Huntington, Minden, North DeSoto, Booker T. Washington and Woodlawn.

Bossier is a newcomer, having moved up from District 1-3A. Former District 1 members Neville and Franklin Parish are now part of an official District 2 with Grant, Tioga and Peabody. Bastrop is now a member of District 1-3A.

Huntington and Minden competed with the Monroe-area teams for district honors last year with Huntington finishing runner-up to Neville.

Northwood won the division with area schools, and North DeSoto was second

Northwood, Huntington and North DeSoto will play the role of favorites this season.

Northwood is coming off a 9-3 season. The Falcons reached the

quarterfinals of the playoffs, falling to eventual state champion Westgate 34-32.

Northwood returns one of the state's top players. Defensive back Mar'javious Moss was the 2021 District 1 Defensive MVP and a first-team LSWA Class 4A All-State selection.

First-team All-District guarterback Mason Welch and running back Quintavion White are also back along with second-team receiver Marc Denison and second-team running back Fabian Evans.

Welch passed for 1,786 yards and 15 touchdowns last season. He also scored six rushing TDs.

First-team All-District offensive lineman Jamarrion Kennedy and defensive lineman T'derius Collins also return.

The return of first-team All-District 2 guarterback Kamron Evans is one reason Huntington is among the favorites.

He led the Raiders to a 9-3 record last season, passing for 2,920 vards and 36 touchdowns in the regular season. For the full season, he threw for 3,630 yards and 44

touchdowns.

Damarion Carter, the team's second-leading receiver last season, is also back. He caught 47 passes for 666 vards and 11 touchdowns.

First-team All-District defensive lineman Jaylon Buckner and linebacker Michael Casey, a first-team selection at Athlete, also return.

North DeSoto went 6-6 last season with two of the losses comina against Northwood. The Falcons won 13-7 in the regular-season finale in a game that decided the District 1 title and 19-9 in the second round of the playoffs.

First-team All-District running back Brian Banks and second-team quarterback Sam Odom return. First-team placekicker Landon Falls is also back.

Seven other second-team All-District players return, including four on defense.

Evangel Christian, coming off a 3-8 season, returns receiver Parker Fulghum, the District 1 Offensive MVP.

Fulahum cauaht 70 passes for 1,156 yards and seven touchdowns last season.

In the last three seasons, either Byrd or Captain Shreve has been at the top of the District 1-5A standings.

Shreve shared the title with Airline in 2019. Byrd won it outright in 2020. Shreve and Byrd shared it last season.

The Gators and Yellow Jackets are again favorites to claim the title. But it won't be a big surprise if another team steps up and takes it.

Byrd, which went 9-2 last season, has experience on both sides of the ball.

Quarterback Lake Lambert is back to run the Jackets' veer option offense, which averaged 331.7 yards per game last season. Devon Strickland, the team's leading rusher with 937 yards on 133 carries, also returns.

First-team All-District linebacker Brooks Brosette and lineman Isaiah Ford are among five starters that return on defense.

Captain Shreve has a new head coach in Adam Kirby. He replaces Bryant Sepul-

vado, now an assistant principal at the school.

Shreve is led by veteran quarterback Kenyon Terrell, a first-team All-District selection who led the Gators to a 10-2 record. Terrell passed for 2,072 yards and 21 touchdowns. He also rushed for 413 and nine.

Shreve lost its top two receivers, but Marquez Stevenson, perhaps the fastest player in Class 5A, returns along with Cam Randolph.

Linebacker Scotty Simo and defensive back Tre Miller are other players to watch.

After losing to Shreve 46-21 in the regular season, Parkway upset the No. 2 seed Gators 30-23 in the second round of the playoffs. The Panthers finished 8-5 after losing to Acadiana in the quarterfinals.

Parkway has a new quarterback in Ashton Martin, who transferred from Shreve during the last school year. Martin saw extensive action at Shreve as a sophomore. But a preseason injury caused him to miss all but a few plays of last season.

The Panthers have one of the state's top running backs in Jaylan White, a three-year starter.

Second-team All-District tight end Jatavious Calhoun is also back along with second-team lineman Chandler Davis.

First-team All-District end Ray Mayweather and linebacker Barrett Newman lead the returning starters on defense.

Benton should also be in the championship mix.

Second-team All-District quarterback Gray Walters and his top receiver, first-team selection Pearce Russell, are back along with secondteam running back Greg Manning. The trio helped the Tigers finish 8-4 last season in their second season in Class 5A.

Benton must replace its top two offensive linemen but three other starters return.

Linebacker Zach Halbert, the All-Parish Defensive MVP, and secondteam All-District defensive back Sawyer Simmons return.

Colin Rains returns for his third season as the starting quarterback at Haughton. A threat passing and running, he was a first-team All-District selection at Athlete. Running back Tyler Rhodes, who came on strong in the second half of last season, also returns. Two-year starter Peyton Polk is one of the area's best offensive lineman.

Second-team All-District linebacker Connor Blank leads four returning starters on defense.

Scouting report

The Vikings will be looking for stability at quarterback. Three players saw significant playing time at the position last season. Preston Dornier and Ben Taylor were expected to battle for the starting job. Either one will have a talented pair of receivers in Daxton Chavez and Cameron Jefferson. Tre Jackson, who gained over 600 yards last season, returns. Guard Reid Hawsey is back on the line. Bob Patterson, a TE who can play WR and H-Back, should be an impact player.

The Vikings allowed 28.3 points per game last season but with a solid group of returning players that number should go down this season. Jeremiah Boudreaux, one of the area's top hurdlers last spring, has moved from WR to DB. He has the potential to be one of the best in the area. Chris Montgomery, Kye Lehr and Braden Linton also return in the secondary. Carter Tate and Jaylon Shuemake are experienced linemen. End Kam Wilson is another player looking to make a name for himself. Mark Engelke leads the LB corps.

The Vikings have something to prove after going 1-9 last season. Airline has a strong non-district schedule. If the Vikings can have some success, the confidence gained should carry over into district play. The offense has the potential to put a lot of points on the board. How the defense comes together will be key. Airline won't be among the teams favored to win the District 1-5A title. But the other district teams better not take the Vikings lightly.

The 6-foot-4 Chavez caught 28 passes for 314 yards last season. Those numbers should increase significantly this season. He is a big target with great speed.



Cam Jefferson WR, Sr.

Jefferson was the fifth-leading receiver in the parish las season with 29 catches for 452 yards and three touchdowns. A three-sport athlete with great speed, he was a member of the Vikings' 4X200meter relay team that qualified for the state meet.



Carter Tate DL, Sr.

A second-team All-Parish selection last season, Tate had 25 tackles, including five for loss, seven assists, three sacks and one forced fumble. He will play a larger role this season.

Scouting report

The Tigers have five returning starters on offense, including quarterback Gray Walters, receiver Pearce Russell and running back Greg Manning. All three were firstteam All-Parish selections last season, and all are among the best players in the area at their respective positions. The line will be somewhat inexperienced, but Carson McCormack and Travis Flowers return. Kaleb Tree will be among the new starters. TE/WR Andy Lim saw action last season and is expected to be a major contributor. Brady Blaylock and Jeff King are new receivers. Speedy RB Landon Duggan can make big plays. The Tigers lost veteran kicker RJ Moore to graduation. Parkway transfer Peyton May will be the placekicker.

Five starters return on defense, led by linebacker Zach Halbert, the All-Parish Defensive MVP, and first-team All-Parish DB Sawyer Simmons, a free safety. Also returning are DT Brooks Spann, LB Cole Weir and CB Landon Duggan. New starters include DT Brandon Sanders, LB Bernie Walters and CB Ashton Jordan. Miller Malley or Cole Austin will also contribute in the secondary.

The Tigers averaged 33.2 points in the regular season last year. With Walters, Russell and Manning back, Benton has the potential to have one of the best offenses in the area. How the new starters on the line develop will be key. The new receivers will need to take the pressure off Russell, who will obviously be a focus of opposing defenses. Last year, Benton gave up a lot of points to the district's top teams, but the Tigers weren't the only ones to do that. With Halbert and Simmons leading the way, improvement is likely. Just a small improvement could be enough with the points the offense is likely to put up. Expect the Tigers to challenge for the district championship.

A first-team All-Parish and All-District selection last season. Russell caught 53 passes for 1,032 yards and 11 touchdowns. He also averaged 21.6 yards on 16 kickoff returns, taking one back 80 yards for a touchdown.



Zach Halbert LB, Sr.

The Defensive MVP on the All-Parish team and a first-team All-District selection. Halbert had 73 tackles, including 13 for loss, and 4.5 sacks. He forced two fumbles, returned an interception for a touchdown and blocked two kicks.

Scouting report

The Bearkats must replace their quarterback and top rushers and receivers from last season. Returning starters on offense include WRs Sen'Tavian Ball and Ja'karvis Guice, linemen Keith Hall and Ty'keithin Johnson, and PK Cristobal Cruz. Sophomore Quintarion Scott will take over at QB. Head Coach De'Aumante Johnson expects several players to see playing time at RB. Christian Johnson, a first-team All-Parish selection on defense last year, will likely get carries. J'Shaun Youngblood is a young RB with potential. Freshman Dominic Conde could see action at WR.

Defensively, Senior All-Parish LB Christian Johnson has been moved to the line where he should be a disrupter. Other returning starters include S Ja'karvis Guice, linemen Ty'keithin Johnson and Keith Hall, and DE Sen'Tavian Ball. Newcomers with potential are CB J'Shaun Youngblood, S Quintarion Scott and CB Randy Robinson.

Head Coach De'Aumante Johnson did an outstanding job last season getting new athletes to join a program that appears headed in the right direction. During spring practice, he said 46 players participated. The number will likely increase in the fall. But the Bearkats will still have several two-way players and that will be challenging in Class 4A. Scouting report

RB Jaylan White, one of five senior starters returning on offense, is one of the state's best. He will get most of the carries, but Demond Blackwell and freshman Antonio Gladney, also a receiver, should also contribute. New QB Ashton Martin, a senior transfer from Captain Shreve, isn't without experience. Parkway lost its top receivers to graduation, including All-State RB Ron Richmond. But Trenton Lape, an LSU baseball commit who has returned to football after having elbow surgery last October, will help fill the void. Andres Abner and 6-3 Michael Collier both started games last season. Three linemen return - Chandler Davis (6-3, 305), Jake Morton (6-2, 275) and TE Jatavious Calhoun (6-1, 250). Junior Jeremiah Williams (6-3, 350) is a newcomer to watch.

Defense could be the team's strength early in the season. Seven starters return, including first-team All-Parish DE Ray Mayweather, DL Kris Mesloh and LB Barrett Newman, and second-team DBs Ashtin Jackson and Greg Chitman Jr. Also returning are DT BJ Patterson and Amaray Brown, a free safety last season who has been moved to LB. Sophomore transfer DB Camaro Mayo was an All-District 1-4A DB at Huntington last season. New starting FS Carter Wells could also be an impact player. Four other players - Jayden Gulfan, Zayden Taylor, Chamichael Williams and SJ Driggers — are battling for a starting LB spot, but all are expected to contribute.

The Panthers averaged 31 points per game in the regular season last year and have the potential to equal or surpass that this season. If the receivers develop, the passing game could be a strength. Defenses will likely focus on White, but he will be hard to stop. Head Coach Coy Brotherton believes the defensive line has a chance to be something special. That could apply to the whole defense. Parkway may not be the favorite to win the district championship, but it won't be a huge surprise if the Panthers do just that.







Scouting report

The Tigers will have a decidedly new look this season. Ed Orgeron, who went 11-12 in the last two seasons after guiding the Tigers to the 2019 national championship, is gone. Brian Kelly, who was 92-39 in 11 seasons at Notre Dame, is now the head coach.

ineligible last season, senior John Emery Jr. is set to be a featured RB. In his freshman and sophomore seasons, he gained 566 yards. Penn State senior transfer Noah Cain will also have a chance to show what he can do.

LSU ranked 10th in the conference in total defense last season, allowing 372.2 yards per game. The Tigers should be strong up front with the return of BJ Ojulari, Ali Gaye and Maason Smith. Scouting report

New head coach Sonny Cumbie is charged with using his high-ocatane offense philosophy to turn the Bulldogs around after their 3-9 finish last season.

Finding a quarterback in fall camp is priority No. 1 for Cumbie and Co. with Texas Tech transfer Parker McNeil, TCU transfer Matthew Downing, North Colorado transfer Andrew Brister (son of former NFL QB Bubby Brister) and freshmen Landry Lyddy battling it out for that role. Whoever earns the starting job will have plenty of talented targets to throw it. LA Tech returns 59.6% of their receiving yards, 65.3% of their receptions and 59% of their receiving touchdowns from last season.

The Demons underwent several big changes in the offseason. Head Coach Brad Laird has added six new assistants to his staff, including offensive coordinator Cody Crill and defensive coordinator Weston Glazer. NSU also signed nine junior college transfers and added several players from the FBS transfer portal. All told, there are about 30 new faces.

Senior Kaleb Fletcher and sophomore Zachary Clement return at quarterback. Clement started the season-finale victory over McNeese State. Fletcher led the team in passing yards last season with 1,313 in seven games. Clement had 1,023 in nine.

Junior Scooter Adams returns at RB. He was a first-team All-SLC selection in the 2021 spring season but played in only four games in the fall before suffering an injury. The Demons lack experience at WR. Junior receiver Javon Antonio had a very good spring and the coaching staff has high expectations for him.

NSU will be looking for improvement on defense. Last year, the Demons allowed 34.09 points and 443.2 yards per game. Cornerback Shemar Bartholomew and safety PJ Herrington, both seniors, were preseason first-team All-SLC selections. Seniors DL Isaiah Longino and Jomard Volsin were second-team picks.

This is a pivotal year for Laird and NSU. If some young receivers develop, the Demons will have the potential to put some points on the board. But improvement by the defense will be the key to contending for the SLC title.

Scouting report

The Cowboys made significant progress last season in Mike McCarthy's second season. But it ended on a disappointing note with an upset loss to the 49ers at home in the first round of the playoffs. The good news is Dallas looks to be in good shape to repeat as NFC East champion.

Quarterback Dak Prescott, entering his seventh season, is coming off the second-best season of his career. In media interviews, he has said he's in the best shape of his life. McCarthy said Prescott's running ability will be utilized more this season. With WR Amari Cooper traded to Cleveland, CeeDee Lamb will be called upon to do even more than he has in his first two seasons. Michael Gallup also returns along with TE Dalton Schultz, who is playing with the franchise tag. RB Ezekiel Elliott's production has declined, but he remains a potentially potent weapon. Tony Pollard also returns. 2021 All-Pro Zack Martin leads an OL that has some question marks.

The Cowboys ranked in the middle of the pack in total defense last season, allowing 351.0 yards per game. But more importantly, they led the league in takeaways with 34, including 26 interceptions. A solid core group returns, including CB Trevon Diggs, the league-leader in interceptions, and LB Micah Parsons, the Defensive Roo-kie of the Year. Other key returning players include DBs Malik Hooker and Jayvon Kearse, DE DeMarcus Lawrence and LB Leighton Vander Esch. LB Randy Gregory's departure to Denver is a key loss.

If the younger players on defense develop, Dallas has a chance to be as good or better than last season. The offense certainly has the potential to again score a lot of points. Another first-round playoff loss won't be acceptable to fans or owner Jerry Jones.
