the budget.



## Things You Must Know When Painting a House Exterior

Does your house need a new coat of exterior paint? Is the paint flaking or fading, or do you just want to change up the color scheme? No matter the reason, a new exterior paint job can really improve the looks of your home and enhance its curb appeal.

Are you thinking of doing the job yourself? Painting your home's exterior surfaces and trim can be a big job. It requires lots of time and effort, and if it's not done right, it will look shoddy.

You may not realize all the steps necessary to get quality results from your exterior paint project. We've listed them here to inform you what the professionals do to achieve success. And as a warning that if any steps in the process are skipped, you may not like the outcome.

#### 1. GET ALL THE MATERIALS AND TOOLS

Before you even start, it's best to make sure you have everything necessary to complete the project from start to finish. You don't want to have to stop and go to the paint or hardware store for something you forgot.

Some items you'll need include:

Primer

Exterior paint

(flat or eggshell plus exterior semigloss)

Pressure washer Paint sprayer Paintbrushes and rollers Painter's tape Drop cloths Plastic sheeting Ladder Paint scraper Epoxy filler Medium-grit sanding block Putty knife Exterior caulking Caulk gun

Make sure you purchase enough of each item for the square footage of your house. Also, you may need more than one ladder, or even scaffolding, if you have a two-story house.

#### 2. CLEAN SURFACES

The paint will adhere better and go on smoother on a clean surface. Use a pressure washer to remove debris, dirt, and dust. Work from top to bottom, overlapping each stroke for full coverage.

#### **3. REPAIR DAMAGES**

You'll need to fill in any holes or cracks with epoxy filler with a putty knife. Allow epoxy to dry, then sand the surface.

#### 4. PROTECT SURROUNDING AREA

Use drop cloths and plastic sheeting to protect landscaping, outdoor furnishings, or other items in the paint area that can't be moved. Use painter's tape to keep paint from getting on trim, doors, and windows.

#### **5. SCRAPE OFF LOOSE PAINT**

Use a paint scraper to remove any chipped paint. You may need to sand

down these scraped surfaces afterward.

#### 6. FILL IN CRACKS

You'll need to caulk the gaps between siding and trim, and around doors and windows.

#### 7. PRIME IF NEEDED

Primer is not always needed; for example, if you're repainting with the same color or a darker color. However, going to a lighter shade will need a coat of primer. You can use the paint sprayer to apply the primer; however, because of its thickness, you may need to thin the primer out for easier application.

#### 8. PAINT THE SIDING


Fill the paint sprayer with the flat or eggshell exterior paint and spray from top to bottom, overlapping each stroke. Depending on the color of paint, you may need two coats.

#### 9. PAINT THE TRIM

Once the painted siding is dry, remove the sheeting and painter's tape from the windows, trim, and doors. Apply two coats of exterior semi- gloss paint to the trim with a paintbrush.

#### 10. CLEAN UP!

Once every exterior surface is painted, as desired, it's time to clean up the area. Remove any drop cloths that cover non-painted items or areas. Clean up any spills. Remove all tools and materials from the work site.



## Must-Do Fall Home Improvement Projects

ome improvement and maintenance is a year-round endeavor, but there's no shame in admitting that some seasons are more conducive than others to puttering around your house and yard. Those of us who live in the South, for example, know that summer is ideal for plenty of things, but a labor-intensive house project is not one of them.

Autumn, on the other hand, is a great time of year for tackling fall home improvement projects. Temperatures are perfect—not too hot and not too cold—and the humidity no longer feels like a hot, damp blanket tossed on your head as soon as you walk outside.

#### 1. Get rid of single-pane windows

When the winter season arrives, you want to keep the cold air outside, but that can be difficult to do if you have outdated single-pane windows. These windows don't keep homes well insulated.

#### 2. Replace missing shingles

Strong storms or winds can dislodge shingles or even blow them away entirely. If you've already lost a few shingles here and there, or if your roof is nearing the end of its expected lifespan, hire a roofing contractor to inspect the roof and make any necessary repairs.

#### 3. Trim foliage

Overgrown bushes, trees, and shrubs can wreak havoc on your house during a storm. One rogue branch or limb is all it takes to cause thousands of dollars worth of damage.

The best way to avoid this type of damage is to have a professional landscaping or tree services company prune the trees and shrubs on your property—especially those near your house or overhanging the roof—and remove dead or low-hanging branches.

#### 4. Restore your carpet

Keep your carpet fresh, clean, and looking as good as the day it was installed by scheduling a fall carpet cleaning service. Regular vacuuming is important, too, but the average residential vacuum cleaner can't deliver the results of a professional cleaning.

#### 5. Unclog your gutters

From late winter to early summer, your gutters get clogged with everything from leaves to dirt. Get your gutters ready for winter rain and snowmelt (and keep them functioning properly year-round) with the help of a professional gutter cleaning company.

Cleaning gutters on your own puts you at risk for bodily injury, and with the wrong equipment, you can do significant damage to your roof. Let a pro scale the ladder and tackle the job for you.

#### 6. Protect your perennials

Perennial flowers and plants give your landscape a pop of color and visual appeal—and since they return every year, perennials are a great, low-maintenance option if your thumbs aren't exactly green.

Although perennials are beautiful, harsh winter weather can ruin them. Don't let this happen. Hire a landscaper to spread mulch in your flower beds so the plants are well protected. With the right amount of mulch, perennials have a much higher chance of surviving the icy winter temperatures. Plus, the mulch keeps hungry critters away.

#### 7. Clean your fireplace

There's nothing as cozy as lounging in front of a fireplace during the chilly winter season. And the good news is that as long as they're well maintained, fireplaces can be a cost-efficient heat source.

#### 8. Seal attic air leaks

Warm air rises, so if your attic isn't well sealed and insulated, you'll likely pay more than necessary to heat your home through the winter. Old attic insulation or insulation that has been compressed or damaged by water intrusion or nuisance wildlife doesn't do its job very well.

#### 9. Upgrade your furnace
