Most teams eager to turn the page in 2023

With the notable exception of Glenbrook, the 2022 season wasn't one to remember for Webster Parish schools.

The Apaches rolled through the regular season 10-0, winning District 1-1A. In its first year eligible for the LHSAA playoffs, Glenbrook reached the select Division IV quarterfinals before falling to eventual champion Ouachita Christian 28-27 Of the other three teams, only Lakeside finished the regular season .500. The Warriors finished 5-5 after a 4-1 start. They made the playoffs, falling to No. 5 seed Avoyelles 60-0 in the first round. Minden was 4-6 and North Webster 2-8. Neither made the playoffs but both won their final two games.

Last year will be remembered for the shakeup in the playoffs. No more class champions. There were four select and four non-select divisions. That was, of course, the result of the LHSAA's decision to change the definition of a select school, causing many formerly non-select schools to move to select status.

According to media reports, nine schools from Rapides Parish and Monroe have filed suit against the LHSAA, alleging Executive Director Eddie Bonine and the committee didn't have the authority to change the definition under the LHSAA's constitution.

Two schools among the plaintiffs, Carroll and Wossman, are members of District 1-3A, which includes North Webster.

Regardless, a new season is upon us. As always, there is reason for optimism.

While none of the four parish schools are favored to win their respective district championships, all have the potential to be title contenders or at least make a run at the playoffs.

Glenbrook lost many of the players who contributed to last season's success to graduation. They also lost Head Coach David Feaster.

But the cupboard wasn't completely left empty for new Head Coach Reagan Smith.



Easton Sanders, the Apaches' new starting quarterback, has a lot of potential. Landry Powell should be one of the most productive receivers in the district. Speaking of which, 1-1A remains strong. To win the title, teams will have to get through Homer and Haynesville. Glenbrook did that last year.

Minden returns one of District 1-4A's most exciting players in senior Jakobe Jackson. He will line line up anywhere on offense from quarterback to running back to receiver. The District 1-4A schedule will again be a challenge.

North DeSoto, the 2022 non-select Division II runner-up, is the favorite to win the title. Northwood, which shared the title last year with the Griffins, should also be strong again. Ditto for Evangel Christian and Huntington.

But don't count Minden out.

North Webster will be looking for a return to the playoffs after a one-year absence.

Last season, the Knights played in a new-look District 1-3A with Monroe-area schools. They went up against unfamiliar opponents.

The knowledge gained last season should be help-

Union Parish is the defending champion, but the Farmers won't have the state's all-time leading rusher, Trey Holley, now at LSU.

After a strong start, Lakeside found the going tough in District 1-2A. Four of the other five schools in the district made the playoffs. Calvary Baptist is a heavy favorite to defend its title. But the Warriors should be improved. They should do well in non-district play again. That could carry over to district play.

The great thing is every team is 0-0 now. And high school football is very hard to predict. Hopefully, Webster teams will pull off some surprises this season.

Scouting report

Offense: Glenbrook will have a mostly new look on offense. Landry Powell, a first-team All-District 1-1A TE last season, is going to be used at WR. Chase Sentell and Jackson Waller will be counted on as well. The Apaches will be led at QB by junior Easton Sanders. He will have an experienced line to protect him. Seth Mangrum will take over at RB.

Defense: With most of the returning starters playing both ways, the experience is there. But there will be new starters and others in different positions than last season. Three linemen return. Glenbrook will have a seniorled linebacker corps including Jackson Lott, Spencer Brantley, and Garrett Brown.

Overall: The Apaches gained their first district title in LHSAA last year and made it to the quarterfinals of the select Division IV playoffs, falling to eventual champion Ouachita Christian by a point. Repeating those feats may be a challenge with so many new faces. Also, the Apaches play in the toughest district in Class A in the state. Four of the eight teams in the district made it to the quarterfinals last season. Haynesville is back on the rise and will be a contender again for district and state honors. Homer, the 2022 non-select Division IV runner-up, will be back strong again. Those teams are always a challenge. The Apaches are learning a new system under Head Coach Reagan Smith. But Glenbrook shouldn't be underestimated and should hold their own in the district.

Scouting report

Offense: This will be a rebuilding year for the Warriors with only four returning starters and only two seniors. Jamarcus Tellis is the sole senior on the line. He will have sophomore Bryce Parker returning to help get the fairly new line in order. Lakeside will be led by junior QB Taron Riley. He will have senior Jordan Case to carry the ball at RB. Junior James Maxie will be a go-to WR.

Defense: With only four starters returning and not a single senior, experience is going to be an issue. Junior Jamarion Evans is the sole lineman returning. Lakeside will rely on its LBs to stop their opponents. Three juniors carrying the load are Eli Santelices, Jacoby Rankin, and Trevor Tharpe.

Overall: The young Warriors compete in a tough District 1-2A which includes perennial powerhouse Calvary and always-strong Loyola and North Caddo. Lakeside has a manageable non-district schedule and could start the season at least 4-1 before the district. This could give them some momentum heading into the district opener against D'Arbonne Woods. The October schedule is tough with road games against North Caddo and Loyola. It ends with a home game against Calvary. A playoff game could be in the balance with the Green Oaks game. Lakeside was the last rung to make the playoffs last year. The Warriors are going to have to win the winnable games and not slip because the wins are going to determine their playoff life.

Tellis is the lone senior on the line. He will be expected to play a leadership role in that group.



Scouting report

Offense: Minden will have a young team. The Tide will be led by sophomore QB Hudson Brown. He will work behind a senior-less line but will have Jakobe Jackson to target at the slot along with seniors Cameron Mitchell and Maurice Rabb. Jackson may also be worked into QB in some situations. Junior RB Dunovan Robinson and sophomore TE Kameron Harris are among the newcomers who should contribute.

Defense: Minden may be young on the offense but the Tide has a senior-led defense. Seven starters return including seniors Brian Turner and Brennan Benton at CB and seniors Nolan Garms and Omarion Cooley at LB. Jakobe Jackson could cause havoc at S. The line may be a little up-and-coming as Isayvion Emerson will be the sole senior. Two juniors and a sophomore are expected fill out the gap.

Overall: No doubt about it District 1-4A is a beast. Huntington, Northwood, Evangel and North Desoto will be vying for a district title. Minden's defense could cause some trouble on the deep routes. The Crimson Tide opens with tough games against 5A Parkway and 1A power Homer followed by parish rival North Webster. Minden could be middle of the pack in the district race, but don't be surprised if the Tide pull off a few upsets and claim at least a playoff spot.


Garms has made the transition from right tackle to linebacker. He is expected to be a leader of the defense.

One of the best athletes in North Louisiana, Jackson is the type of player who can make plays that change the momentum of games. He will line up at a variety of positions.







Offense: The Purple Knight have only one senior returning on offense, TE Xander Thomason. The offense will be moving back to the Wing-T commanded by sophomore Christian Whitlock. Whitlock will be protected by returning guards Kody Beshea and Sam Morgan. When he decides to let the ball fly, Whitlock will have a former Calvary WR, Xavier "Tutt" McGlothan, target. Camren Lewis is a newcomer to watch at WR. RB Braedon Robertson returns after a solid sophomore season. Speedster JKobe Lawson should complement Robertson in the backfield.

Defense: Not only is JKobe Lawson going to be a threat on offense but he could also cause havoc at CB. The Purple Knights return two seniors in DE Avante Curry and S Jaden Hill. CB "Tutt" McGlothan will also play on both sides of the ball. Sophomore Donte Owens, who had quite of bit of playing time his freshman year, takes over as starting S.

Overall: The lone Class 3A team in Northwest Louisiana, North Webster had a rough run in the Monroe-based District 1-3A last season. The Knights will continue to face challenges in the hard-nosed district. North Webster also has a challenging non-district schedule that includes a much improved Haynesville team at home. North Caddo is not as potent as they were last season, but the Titans are still a viable opponent. They will be followed by parish rival Minden. A surprising four teams headed to the playoffs out of the District 1-3A last season. The Knights weren't among those. If they can get off to a good start and pull some upsets in district, a return to the playoffs is a good possibility.



Scouting report

Offense: QB Jayden Daniels returns to run the offense. He will have one of the nation's top receivers in Malik Nabers. Brian Thomas and Kyren Lacy will likely play bigger roles. Tight end Mason Taylor also returns. RB Logan Diggs, a Notre Dame transfer, should give the running game a boost. Josh Williams, Noah Cain and John Emery Jr. combined for 1,316 yards last season. The line should be a strength with four returning starters.

Defense: DT Maason Smith (6-6, 310) is back after suffering a season-ending injury early last season.

Linebacker Harold Perkins emerged as a star last season. Oregon State transfer Omar Speights is a key addition. The end position is a question mark but the Tigers got help from the transfer portal. Greg Brooks and Major Burns return in the secondary but several transfers will make an impact.

Overall: The Tigers are certainly in position to make a run at the SEC championship in Kelly's second season. Daniels should be even better this season, which means the offense has a chance to be more productive. The defense struggled at times last season, especially in the second half of the year. But the additions through the transfer portal make it stronger. As usual, the Alabama game looms large. This year it's in Tuscaloosa with the Tide out for revenge. Much can happen before, but the game could very well have national title implications.

► Malik Nabers


WR. Jr.

Scouting report

Offense: Alabama State transfer Myles Crawley will likely be the starting quarterback. The redshirt junior has very good size at 6-4. He completed 58 of 96 passes for 785 yards and four TDs with five interceptions last year. Sophomore Julian Calvez passed for 685 yards and five TDs last year. The Tigers will definitely looking for improvement after averaging only 22.6 points per game last season. Lyndon Rash, the team's top WR last season, is back. Sophomores Floyd Chalk IV and Chance Williams provide experience at RB.

Defense: The defense allowed 33 points per game last season, but it could be the Tigers' strength this season. Sundiata Anderson, a 6-5, 240-pound DL, was named the SWAC preseason Defensive Player of the Year. Junior LB Lewis Matthews and sophomore DB Mevin Thomas also earned preseason All-SWAC honors. Matthews was the team's leading tackler.

Overall: The Tigers struggled in Cleveland's first season. GSU has the potential to have a good offense. The development of the QB regardless of who wins the position will determine how good. The return of Rash is a big positive. As usual, the Tigers defense will be coming up against some powerful SWAC offenses. But that unit could be up to the challenge. If they are, Grambling State will finish much higher than the predicted fourth-place finish in the SWAC West division.

LB, Sr.


A first-team preseason All-SWAC selection, Matthews led the team in solo tackles last season with 61. He was second in total tackles with 102, including 12 for loss.

Scouting report

Offense: Boise State transfer Hank Bachmeier, who entered the transfer portal after the fourth game last season, will likely be the starter at QB. He threw for 6,605 yards and 41 touchdowns with and 19 interceptions at Boise. Bachmeier will have some good targets, including Smoke Harris. The Bulldogs lost top receiver Tre Harris to Ole Miss. Marguis Crosby, the team's top rusher, is back. He has been tabbed as one to watch for the 2023 Doak Walker Award. Crosby will have help from Charvis Thornton taking carries for the Bulldogs.

Defense: One of the key reasons for the Bulldogs' 3-9 season was the defense. The Bulldogs ranked

128th out of 131 in average points against at 37.9 per game. The Bulldogs gave up 243.2 rushing yards per game, ranking 130th. They also gave up an average of 11.7 first downs per game and ranked 129th. It's a new year and the Bulldogs can look nothing but up. LB Hugh Davis, who led the team in tackles with 79, returns.

Overall: The Bulldogs are one of only five teams from last season's Conference USA lineup still in the league Enter newcomers Jacksonville State, Liberty, New Mexico State and Sam Houston to the CUSA party. Western Kentucky is considered the conference favorite followed by last year's darlings Liberty Flames. Tech has been projected to finish fourth in the conference. The Bulldogs will at least be in a race for six wins and a bowl bid and could be contenders for the conference title.






Scouting report


