City of Minden and WPSB finalize Griffith Stadium property swap

Discussions about transferring ownership of the property known as Griffith Stadium to the Webster Parish School Board (WPSB) date back decades. After all, they are the primary entity that uses the facility; it's the stadium where Minden High School's baseball team plays its home games. On April 23, those discussions turned into action, as the City of Minden and the Webster Parish School Board agreed to a mutually beneficial arrangement through joint cooperation.

"Griffith Stadium has historically been owned by the City of Minden and used mainly by the Webster Parish School Board, specifically Minden High School. Meanwhile, the City of Minden's water well and water plant are located at the Clerk Street site, which is owned by the school board," said Mayor Nick Cox during the city council meeting where the motion was passed.

The Minden City Council and Webster Parish School Board both approved the property swap back in March. Previously, the City of Minden owned Griffith Stadium, which was primarily used by Minden High School, while the WPSB owned the property where the city's water plant is located on Clerk Street.

This swap allows each party to take ownership of the property they actively use.

The City of Minden plans to decommission the current plant and replace it with a 2-million-gallon-capacity water tank, which will help expand the city's water service coverage.

The signing of the documents took place at Kitchens Law Firm, with Mayor Nick Cox representing the City of Minden and Superintendent Johnny Rowland representing the Webster Parish School Board. After signing the documents, the two governing bodies finalized the property swap, demonstrating their ability to cooperate and bring about positive change.

Correction: Minden Police investigate theft from Ace Hardware

Minden Police Lieutenant Griffith initiated an investigation on April 15 regarding a theft at Ace Hardware. The suspect, identified as Melanie E. Hall, 46, of Hodge, Louisiana, was accompanied by Brandon Lee Lowery.

On April 18, Detective Jason Lee detained both suspects during a traffic stop on Fort Street. They were escorted to the police headquarters for further questioning. Lowery admitted during an interview, after being read his Miranda rights, that Hall had taken a belt from Ace

Hardware without paying. Hall also confessed, post-Miranda, that she stole the belt intending as a gift for Lowery. Lowery, however, remarked that the belt didn't fit him. Correction: Hall was booked for theft and warrants from Bossier Sheriff's Office. Lowery was not charged.

Hedrick speaks on ramp ministry at Lions Club

Lane Hedrick, a member of the ramp ministry performed by Men of Courage, served as the guest speaker at the Minden Lions Club meeting on April 25. The ramp ministry, which builds handicapped ramps for those in need, has been a beacon of hope for many in Webster Parish. Hedrick highlighted the ministry's mission of providing free handicapped ramps to those who re-

quire assistance entering and exiting their homes. "Through this ministry, we are able to reach many people with news of the Lord," said Hedrick. One touching story Hedrick shared involved an elderly lady who, despite having limited resources, insisted on feeding the crew. Her act of generosity touched many hearts, leading a man to restock her cupboards after hearing about her kindness. "That's how this ministry works. It's very far-reaching. We've had people get

saved through these ministries on the day that we built a ramp," explained Hedrick. Remarkably, the ramp ministry has never faced a resource shortage. When a need arises, Hedrick visits the location to assess the requirements. Materials are primarily sourced from Interstate Building Materials or Ace Hardware, both of which provide discounts to support the ministry. Additionally, donations from various businesses and individuals contribute to

the ministry's success. For those interested in supporting the ramp ministry, Hedrick suggested making a payment toward their bill at Interstate Building Materials or donating cash during the Men of Courage meetings at the Civic Center. Hedrick emphasized the diverse support the ministry receives, saying, "There are men in this community from all walks and all denominations of life who show up and help us build these ramps. It's a blessing." He particu-

larly appreciates the involvement of cadets from the Youth Challenge Program, as it allows the men to impart skills and share their faith with the cadets. In closing, Hedrick encouraged everyone to follow God's guidance. "Just do what He says. He's our God. He's the God of all creation." He also challenged individuals to identify those in the community who lack support and to become a positive presence in their lives. "Find somebody in our community that doesn't

have anybody in their lives and be that somebody in their lives. Let's seek those people out. That's what Jesus told us to do. Find those people and serve those people." The Minden Lions Club welcomes potential new members interested in serving the community. Meetings are held every Thursday at noon at the American Legion Memorial Hall, located at 119 W. Pine St. in downtown Minden.

NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM

Dorcheat Museum's Night at the Museum highlights cemetery preservation

The Dorcheat Museum's recent Night at the Museum event, held on April 15, featured a compelling talk by Museum Director Jessica Gorman on the critical topic of cemetery preservation. Gorman, a passionate advocate for historical preservation, emphasized the importance of maintaining and repairing cemeteries for future generations, highlighting their role as records of our past. Gorman's interest in

cemetery preservation began long before the pandemic, but it was during the lockdowns of 2020 that she found the time to start pursuing this interest in earnest. Starting with the cleaning of headstones in the Minden Cemetery of her own family in Webster Parish, Gorman gradually expanded her efforts to other parishes and states. Attending workshops on cemetery preservation and repair in 2021, including the Louisiana Trust for Historic Pres-

ervation's headstone cleaning workshop and the Atlas Preservation 48 State Tour cleaning and repair workshop, Gorman honed her skills. In 2022, she put these skills to work by repairing the Loye family plot at the Minden Cemetery, highlighting the need for such interventions, especially in cases where families no longer exist to care for their graves. Gorman emphasized several key principles for caring for headstones, including getting permis-

sion first, avoiding contacting stone with metal, using only approved solutions like the D/2 Biological Solution, and seeking expert help for repairing broken stones. She underscored the challenges faced by many cemeteries, which often lack sufficient funding for anything beyond basic maintenance like mowing. Looking ahead, Gorman expressed the need for more people to become involved in cemetery preservation efforts. She invited those inter-

ested in learning more to attend the upcoming 48 State Tour workshops in Natchitoches on June 17, which will focus on preserving local cemeteries. More information can be found at 48statetour.com. Gorman emphasized, "Cemeteries are a cultural resource. Cemeteries record the history of a place. They are also a source of genealogical information. In the case of children, for some of them, their grave is the only record that they ever existed. Caring for cemeteries is part of

the cultural well-being of a community." "In order to provide the care [that cemeteries need], we've got to get people who want to be involved, who are willing to educate themselves, and who will actually get out there and do the work," said Gorman. For those interested in assisting Gorman in her volunteer efforts, she welcomes individuals joining her in this vital work of preserving historical records for future generations.

Warm season vegetable gardening

The official start of spring was March 21. For many, it is that time of year when daylight hours are increasing, bringing warmer days and nights,

and it starts encouraging people to spend more time outside. The vegetable gardener is one such person. They start by collecting soil samples, to know the proper nutrients needed for desired

crop, and monitor the weather for the optimum time to plant their vegetables. Below are examples of vegetables that can be grown during the spring and summer:

Snap Bean	3/15-5/15	plant seed 1/2 inch deep	2-3 inches	48-55 days
Sweet corn	3/1-5/15	plant seeds 1/2 inch deep	10-12 inches	69-92 days

Hot Peppers	4/1-6/15	transplants 1 inch deep	12-18 inches	70-80 days

Tomatoes	3/20-6/30	transplants 1 inch deep	18-24 inches	60-75 days
Watermelons	3/15-6/30	plant seeds 1/2 inch deep	36-60 inches	90-110 days

CASA hosts Light of Hope event at Academy Park

April 24 at Academy Park a local non-profit called CASA, Court Appointed Special Advocates, held an event called Light of Hope for National Child Abuse Prevention Month in order to raise awareness. Lagniappe Montessori was there providing a musical performance and Ashlee Drake, representing the mayor’s office, read a proclamation declaring April Child Abuse Prevention and Awareness Month in the City of Minden.

The proclamation read,

“Whereas, April marks the start of Child Abuse Awareness Month for a memorial for all the children who have suffered from some form of abuse and neglect this past year; and whereas, Volunteers for Youth Justice Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), in association with the National CASA Association, speak for the best interest of abused and neglected children who are involved in the juvenile courts; and whereas, in an effort to increase awareness of child abuse and aid in its prevention, CASA is hosting its annual “Light of Hope”

event...

Now, therefore, I, Nicholas A. Cox, mayor of the City of Minden, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2024 as “Child Abuse Prevention and Awareness Month” in the City of Minden. In doing so, I urge all citizens to join in a national effort to raise awareness for and help prevent child abuse and neglect.”

Sandra Samuel, CASA supervisor, explained the role that CASA plays in the cases of abused or neglected children. “I work for a program under the Volunteers for Youth Justice called CASA. We are

court appointed special advocates. In Webster Parish whenever a child is neglected or abused and removed from their home, the court system assigns our program,” said Samuel.

“We’re a second set of eyes and ears. We go into the home that they are placed in and we check on them every month and we write a report to the judge to let them know if there is anything they need or whatever else is going on in the home.”

The event was held not only to raise awareness for child abuse prevention, but also to raise



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awareness for the CASA program and its need for volunteers. Samuel stated that, in Webster Parish alone, there are currently 27 cases that encompass 57 children. With only eleven volunteers currently, this can stretch their numbers a little thin, so the more volunteers the program can muster,

President Reagan Was Right
His ‘Star Wars’ Missile Defense COULD ‘Hit a Bullet with a Bullet’ and Save Israel from Iran’s Missile Attack

From the days of my youth, I recall with great fondness the presidency of President Ronald Reagan. Full disclosure—my brother Tom was working on the White House Staff at the time, and I was attending The Heights Preparatory School in Potomac, Maryland. So, on the weekends, I rode the Metro down to D.C. to meet my brother at the White House where we would often remain in his office late on Saturday nights as he wrapped up his work for the week.

I clearly remember Pres. Reagan’s unbounded optimism about America and its place in the world, his strong domestic record including record employment and an economy exploding with growth, his focus on the traditional family unit and the conservative social values that were its foundation, and his view of the need for America to be militarily strong.

It is in connection with this need for America to maintain a powerful and unquestioned military advantage over our enemies that I write this article.

One of the many defense initiatives of President Reagan—the Strategic Defense Initiative (SDI)—was based upon his recognition that the most effective strategy against the former Soviet Union’s ever-increasing number and capacity of ballistic missiles was to develop a technology by which such missiles could be shot down from

space. While the U.S. never created a space-based system, the same technology developed because of that initiative has been stunningly successful.

President Reagan wisely concluded that in the nuclear age the traditional deterrence strategy of ‘mutual assured destruction’ (MAD) was, in fact, insane and amounted to a global suicide pact between the United States and the Soviet Union.

Well, as others have also observed, the individual who saved Israel two weeks ago from direct attack by Iran was President Reagan.

As the Wall Street Journal recounts: “allow me to identify who saved the people of Israel last weekend from Iran’s missile barrage: Ronald Reagan. In 1983, President Reagan in a televised speech proposed what he called the Strategic Defense Initiative. Its core idea was that the U.S would build defense systems that could shoot down nuclear-armed ballistic missiles, then expected to be fired by the Soviet Union at the U.S. mainland.” (WSJ, D. Henninger, 04-18-2024).

Unsurprisingly, liberal members of Congress and the liberal establishment at the time mocked the idea, deriding the program as “Star Wars”

I was later working in D.C. in the U.S. Congress for the late Clyde C. Holloway, former Congressman and Public Service Commissioner, and recall having a conversation with a liberal colleague of mine who worked in the same House office building. He said to me regarding SDI “well, it’s not going to be able to knock down every missile anyway, so what’s the point in having it?” I remember being astounded and responded that “if we could knock down 98 or 99 out of 100 incoming nuclear missiles, that was still very good and worth pursuing!”

Also unsurprisingly, then-Senator Joe Biden was wrong about this issue as well, saying in a 1986 speech that “Star Wars represents a fundamental assault on the concepts, alliances and arms-control agreements that have buttressed American security for several decades ... “ (WSJ, Id.) Of course, President Biden, who mocked and opposed the program, is currently accepting congratulations from the technology’s recent success in Israel.

How do we prove how correct Reagan was? “By universal acclamation, the hero of last weekend was Israel’s missile-defense systems. The world

watched in real time Saturday night as Reagan’s commitment to shooting down missiles protected Israel’s population from the more than 300 drones and ballistic and cruise missiles fired by Iran and its proxies at cities across Israel.” (WSJ, Id.)

We should also recall that this initiative of President Reagan so spooked the Soviet Union that Reagan’s unwillingness to abandon the program prompted him to abruptly walk out of a summit in Reykjavik, Iceland with Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev.

It is also only fair to mention that President Trump supports and restarted Reagan’s missile defense initiative in 2019. It will become only more important in time and the nation owes Pres. Reagan great credit for understanding its significance and thrusting the initiative forward.

President Reagan concluded his address to the nation introducing the Strategic Defense Initiative on the evening of March 23rd, 1983, from the Oval Office.

Thank God for his foresight and resolve.

My Recovery Began Around Our Dining Table

It’s October 27, 1981 in Mountain Home, Arkansas.

My road to recovery began at our table when the visiting minister, whom I hadn’t seen since I was fourteen, asked me if I remembered when he picked me up at our house on Hall Ridge Road in the woods near Noel, Missouri, to take me to my temporary foster home at Cullen and Martha Adair’s house in Grove, Oklahoma on March 30, 1962.

Blinded by tears I relived that evening when I left my mother after I packed my clothes in a brown paper bag.

I didn’t look back as I got into the car with Brother Fred Webb.

It was an easy adjustment living with the family who had two adopted Native American children, Ann and Chuck.

I was in awe. It was comforting to share meals around a table with this caring family. Hugs were new to me and given freely, not to mention hot baths, clean clothes, a warm bed and being tucked into bed at night.

Everyone at church was also so kind to me.

I bonded easily to my new family, blinded to what was ahead.

To have a Donna Reed style mother who laughed and hummed and a dad with a non-stop sense of humor was a fairy tale to me.

I didn’t realize how much I’d fallen in love with this family until the day arrived on May 30, 1962 for me to leave for the orphanage.

During breakfast my eyes became fixed upon the clock. Counting down the hours and then the minutes my security slipped away.

Reality didn’t hit me until we arrived at the orphanage near Tulsa, Oklahoma, one hundred miles away.

As we walked to the house, I heard her screaming inside.

Then she appeared at the door with her plastic smile and

steely gray eyes!

I sobbed “please don’t leave me here!”

But the decision was made.

I found the housemother to be as devoid of love as the cinder blocks from which the dormitory style house was built!

At night I sobbed with my head under the pillow because crying was not allowed.

On Sunday I wore the blue gingham jumper that Martha had just finished making for me.

As we were leaving the bus I spotted the Adair family standing nearby. I ran to them as my housemother tried to restrain me saying I couldn’t have visitors during my three month period of adjustment.

Breaking loose I ran to them.

I sat with them in church but the grief started all over again when I returned to the home.

I never accepted the fact that I wouldn’t get to go live with the Adairs but I knew intellectually that “all things work together for good to them that love the Lord” and that faith sustained me but never stopped me from laying in bed reliving their hugs again and again.

I escaped into memories.

To be given love until we are addicted and then have it jerked away is so painful.

This may be a tool God uses to till our hearts, to shape us into what He wants us to be even though the growth process is very difficult.

On the last night of our revival in 1981 our eleven year old adopted daughter, Robin, was baptized by Brother Webb, the same minister who had baptized me shortly before I left my home in 1962.

This is one more of those “God Wink” moments I cherish!

I wonder who I would be today if Fred Webb, from Hatley, Mississippi, hadn’t taken the time to ask me what I remembered so many years before. Even though my life has been painful I wouldn’t trade what I’ve been through if I had to lose the joy I feel today!

I want to be real!

Slow Down: The Rush to Reform Louisiana’s Constitution

As someone who has long advocated for a thorough review and, if necessary, reform of Louisiana’s constitution, I find myself in a unique position to offer a cautionary perspective on the current push for constitutional changes.

While the desire to address the state’s fiscal challenges and streamline governance is commendable, the speed at which these proposals are being advanced during the ongoing legislative session is cause for concern.

Governor Jeff Landry’s call for a “reorganization” of our constitution, echoed by legislative leaders, underscores the urgency felt by many in addressing the complexities

and shortcomings of our current governing document. However, as history has shown, the process of constitutional reform is fraught with pitfalls, and rushing through such a monumental task risks unintended consequences that could have far-reaching implications for generations to come.

The governor’s focus on attracting residents from other states and improving

opportunities for Louisiana families is undoubtedly noble. Still, the devil lies in the details, particularly when it comes to fundamental rights, fiscal flexibility, and the structure of government.

As the Pelican Institute for Public Policy rightly points out, our current constitution, with its 216 amendments and 72,000 words, has become unwieldy. A structured and deliberate approach to reform could produce a highly desirable outcome.

While the need for reform is undeniable, the current approach feels rushed, even if the proponents have thought out things. Rushing to overhaul the constitution without due consideration

for its long-term ramifications risks exacerbating rather than alleviating the very problems it seeks to solve.

This doesn’t mean we sit on our hands and hope things just work out. It is no time for “analysis paralysis.” As Daniel Erspamer, CEO of the Pelican Institute, aptly states, “Their fear mongering is getting louder and louder.”

As a state, we must resist the temptation to succumb to the pressure for immediate action and instead commit ourselves to a comprehensive, inclusive, and transparent process of constitutional review.

This means engaging stakeholders from all sectors of society, soliciting in-

put from legal experts and constitutional scholars, and taking the time to weigh the pros and cons of proposed reforms carefully.

As things progress this week, I urge our legislators and policymakers to heed the lessons of history and proceed with caution.

Let us not rush headlong into constitutional changes that may have unforeseen consequences but rather take the time to ensure that any reforms undertaken serve the best interests of all Louisianans, both now and in the future.

Doyline's Harris aims for four titles at state meet

Doyline senior Izayla Harris leads Webster Parish athletes who are bound for the Ochsner LHSAA Outdoor Track & Field State Meet this week at LSU.

Harris will try to win four state championships. The last two years, she won the 100, 200 and 400 meters in the Class B meet. Last year, she set class records in all three.

Harris also finished second in the triple jump.

She won all four events and in the Region I-B meet last week, taking the 100 in 11.77 seconds, the 200 in 25.46 and the 400 in 1:01.08. She also won the triple jump with a leap of 35 feet, 3 inches.

She finished 1.24 seconds ahead of Florien's Lehr Turner in the 100, 2.42 ahead of Quitman's Sunni Altheimer in the 200 and 4.12 ahead of Simsboro's Bella Coon in the 400.

Her distance in the triple jump was 4-2 1/2 farther than that of Castor's Sky McMullan.

Harris' distance in the triple jump was the best among qualifiers from the three Class B regions. Midland's Olivia Cane, the Region 3 champion, had the second-best at 32-10.5. The 2023 champion, Irene Kaiser of Episcopal, graduated.

Harris wasn't Doyline's only region champion. Jonas Florence won the discus with a throw of 114-1 3/4. He edged Castor's Caden Bryant, who threw 113-4.

In all seven LHSAA

Homin' in on a Grand Slam

In just about every sport, there are participants who set personal goals. For example, a baseball player aspires to hit .400; basketball players hope for a triple-double. For golfers, it's a hole-in-one.

It is no different in the world of the hunter/angler. Bass fishermen look for a lunker weighing in double-digits while deer hunters long for a buck with a rack impressive enough to "make the book". For turkey hunters, there's the Grand Slam.

Although I would love to have a 10 pound bass on my wall and my name in the Boone and Crockett records for trophy bucks, this is not what makes my motor run. What lights my fire is to hear the thunderous gobble of a long-beard wild turkey gobbler on a spring morning.

The thoughts of my completing a Grand Slam in turkey hunting was about as remote as me making a hole-in-one. That was before I had the chance to hunt turkeys in South Dakota.

To pull off a wild turkey Grand Slam, it is necessary to take one of each of the four sub-species of wild turkeys found in the U.S. These include Easterns, which inhabit much of the south, east and northeast; Rio Grande turkeys, residents of arid mesquite and cactus country of the southwest; Osceolas which are residents only of the southern half of Florida, and Merriams of the mountains and plains of the mid-west.

To accomplish such a task, it would be necessary for a lot of things to fall into place, and there would be an abundance of travel-

ing involved. Frankly, I just didn't see that happening.

One spring afternoon as the sun slipped behind a hill in the Badlands of South Dakota, I completed my Grand Slam. First, a little history of what brought me to this point I never thought I'd reach.

My first turkey hunt was a half-hearted effort when a writer friend invited me to his home state of Alabama to hunt. On April 13, 1992, my guide, Skinny Hallmark, called in a gobbling longbeard off a hillside to my gun and in that moment, something happened

that would forever change the way I look at spring mornings. It was love at first GOBBLE.....BOOM, and I've chased these wary birds every spring since.

The Alabama gobbler was an Eastern sub-species and I gradually learned what turkey hunting was all about.

In 2000, I jumped at the opportunity to hunt another of the sub-species, the Rio Grande. While hunting with Al Brasuel and sons in south Texas I downed my first Rio Grande. The thought of a Grand Slam only teased the margins

of my mind; I saw no way that I'd ever travel to south Florida or to the Great Plains to turkey hunt. That was before Keith Brasuell called me one day inviting me to ride with him to Naples, Florida for an Osceola hunt. Good fortune accompanied me when a mature Osceola gobbler strutted in front of my shotgun.

Like a bolt from the blue, it hit me. All of a sudden, I found myself only one bird away from a coveted Grand Slam. Could I do it? Could I figure out a way to head somewhere up north where Merriams live?

Soon after returning from Florida, I found a press release from the South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks making a pitch for their great hunting and fishing opportunities. The release talked about the great trout fishing; super walleye angling; wonderful deer and elk hunting....and here is what caught my eye....an abundance of Merriams gobblers.

On a hunch, I called the South Dakota agency, got the go ahead and flew into Rapid City.

In addition to securing a Black Hills gobbler tag, I was one of the fortunate few who also snagged a Prairie tag. This would double my chances for a Merriams, and if things worked out right, I might even get two gobblers which, incidentally I did.

On the last minute of the last hour of the last day of my Prairie hunt, I bagged a big 21 pound Merriams.

There's no 10 pound bass hanging on my wall nor is my name in the Boone and Crockett book but, by George, there's a wild turkey Grand Slam hanging on my wall and I couldn't be more proud..

and jerk baits around the docks. Stripers are beginning to school and hitting shad imitation lures. Bream are on the beds and worms and crickets are working on them. Catfishing has been good on night crawlers. For latest information, call Kel's Cove at 927-2264 or Terzia Tackle at 278-4498.

CANEY LAKE – Big chinquapins are on the beds and some real good fish are being caught on small crawfish, worms and crickets. Best bass catches are made fairly shallow on Wacky Worms, Sinko, Bandits and spinners with some moving out to deeper water. Crappie are mostly done with the spawn and are best fishing jigs or shiners around submerged tops in 12 foot water. 2. To simultaneously create two drilling and production units for the exploration for and production of gas and condensate from the Haynesville Zone, Reservoir A, to be designated HA RA SU154 and HA RA SU155, as shown on the plat submitted with the application.
3. To force pool and integrate all of the separately owned tracts, mineral leases and other property interests located within the proposed units in accordance with Section 10, Title 30, of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, with each tract sharing in unit production on a surface acreage basis of participation.
4. To permit EnSight to drill, designate and utilize five horizontal wells, one of which to serve as a unit well and the other four to serve as alternate unit wells for HA RA SU115, at the locations and in the general manner shown on the plat submitted with the application, or at any other legal locations within such unit.

Doyline man arrested for allegedly brutalizing dog in his care

A Doyline man is facing charges of aggravated cruelty to animals after allegedly brutally killing a dog left in his care. Jeremy Shane Patterson, 48, was identified by Webster Parish Sheriff Jason Parker as the individual responsible for the heinous act.

Parker stated that Patterson is being held at Bayou Dorcheat Correctional Center on a \$50,000 bond. The incident came to light when officers responded to a call from the

owner of the residence where Patterson was living. The owner reported finding the dog dead in a bathtub, still covered with water.

According to Parker, Patterson had sent a text message claiming he had drowned the dog. Further investigation revealed that Patterson had allegedly struck the dog ten times with an exercise weight before drowning it in the bathtub.

"The vicious way this poor dog was killed is unimaginable," Parker

stated. "To do something like this to a defenseless animal is cruel beyond belief, and we simply will not tolerate it. We urge the people of our parish to report any crime, and that includes mistreatment of animals."

Patterson's case highlights the importance of reporting animal cruelty and the need to hold perpetrators accountable for their actions. The investigation is ongoing, and Patterson is presumed innocent until proven guilty.

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
