Uncertain 2024 makes predictions a challenge

It's always a challenge to predict what might happen in a particular high school football season. There are just too many uncertainties.

With openers looming for the four parish teams, the 2024 season in Webster Parish is no exception.

Will we see a turnaround like the one North Webster produced last season, going from 2-8 in 2022 to 7-5?

The Minden Crimson Tide will be looking to bounce back from a 3-8 season. Last year, the Tide lost some close games early then finished the season strong.

They will be looking to build off that momentum. Hudson Brown returns after a solid junior season. Senior running back Dunovan

Robinson played well down the stretch. Four out of five starters on the offensive line return. The defense should be improved with the return of seven starters, including first-team All-District 1-4A selection Demetrius Robinson.

Speaking of 1-4A, the district has a new look with the departures of Evangel Christian and Huntington to 1-5A and the addition of Southwood, a program that has been down for several years.

But stalwarts North DeSoto, the defending champion, and Northwood remain. Does Minden have what it takes to break their stranglehold on the district? Three developments in the offseason loom large. Michael Santelices stepped down as head

coach at Lakeside. John Ware stepped down as head coach at North Webster after 12 seasons and promptly replaced Santelices, who remains as an assistant.

Then Christopher Wilson was hired to replace Ware. Wilson knows what it takes to win championships. He was an assistant at North DeSoto the last two seasons, helping the Griffins achieve unprecedented success. He takes over a North Webster team that should contend for the District 1-3A championship with 15 returning starters. Among those is running back Braedon Robertson, who will be looking for another big season. Ware is taking over a Lakeside team that has moved from District 1-2A to 3-2A. The Warriors got off to a 3-1 start last season

before losing six straight as injuries piled up. Glenbrook is coming off an 8-3 season in Reagan Smith's first season as head coach. The Apaches reached the second round of the select Division IV playoffs. Glenbrook lost most of the key players who contributed to that success to graduation. But senior Easton Sanders, one of the area's best athletes, returns at quarterback. Defending champion Haynesville, the runner-up in non-select Division IV last season, is a big favorite to repeat. But Glenbrook has the potential to be the Tors' main challenger.

Scouting report

Offense: The Apaches will be inexperienced after losing several key members off last season's team, including leading rusher Chase Sentell and receiver Landry Powell. But Senior QB Easton Sanders returns after a solid 2023 season. He'll have a big target in 6-foot-5 senior TE Brayson Cummings. Senior RB Jackson Waller figures to have a big year. The offensive line, anchored by sophomore G Nolan Still (6-1, 327), will be a strength. Senior G Daivari Jackson and sophomore Franklin Bridwell also give the Apaches strength and size up front.

Defense: The line will be a strength. Senior Daivari Jackson will be looking for a breakout season. Senior Jonathan Bryant (5-9, 250) will be a disruptive force with his strength. Nolan Still will be a factor on both sides of the ball. DE Brayson Cummings is expected to contribute. Senior Cade Vining is a returning starter at MLB. Senior Seth Mangrum and Jackson Waller are veteran DBs.

Overall: The Apaches lost several key leaders to graduation, but they have the potential to have another very good season. Easton Sanders can make big plays passing and running. Jackson Waller will have an impact on both sides of the ball. The defense is big and strong. There is a good mixture of players from sophomores to seniors. If things fall into place, Glenbrook will be in the thick of the chase for the district championship.


Scouting report

Offense: Junior Brock Case returns at quarterback. James Maxie and Eli Santilices figure to be his main receivers. RB Taron Riley is a returning starter. Kentravion Miller should be a force at fullback. TE Trevor Tharpe is a strong blocker who will also be counted on as a receiver. Three senior starters return on the line — center Eli Campbell, guard Jamarion Evans and tackle Willie Jenkins.

Defense: James Maxie, Taron Riley and Eli Santalices lead what should be a strong secondary. Kentravion Miller is back at LB and should be a playmaker. DE Trevor Tharpe is expected to play a big role. Willie Jenkins and Jamarion Evans will anchor the line.

Overall: The Warriors got off to a strong start last season before injuries decimated the team in the second half of the season. Lakeside has moved from District 1-2A to 3-2A which includes perennial power Many. But the Warriors' schedule sets up well for them. One issue is the number of two-way players and depth, which is something 2A schools often face. Conditioning will be key. John Ware is a proven success as a head coach. He can turn things around but there will be challenges.

Offense: Hudson Brown returns at OB after a solid sophomore season. RB Dunovan Robinson, who excelled down the stretch last season, is also back. They are among seven starters returning. Both will benefit from a line with four veterans led by 6-foot-4, 290-pound Jonathan Bradford. Heard is expecting big things from TE Mikey Shepherd and WR Jaxon Smith, an outstanding athlete. Porter Neal and Caylien Aubrey saw significant action at the wing/slot position last year. Neal is coming off an outstanding track season. Braxton Glover, a soccer player, is the new kicker.

Defense: Seven starters return led by three-year starter Demetrius Robinson up front and Brayden Britton in the secondary. Other returnees include DE Jarvis Davis, LB Jaylon McKinney and LB Landyn Huddleston. Heard expects 6-4 Kameron Harris to be a force in the middle of the secondary. S Treshun Young's speed will be an asset. Brody Glover, a soccer player, will handle punting

Overall: Minden was a better team last season than its record showed. With a lot of experience on both sides of the ball, the win count should go up significantly this season. The Tide had trouble staying with District 1-4A's top teams, North DeSoto and Northwood, last year. They will be in a better position to compete with them this season. If they can do that, the Tide will be in the thick of the title race.

Offense: Junior Christian Whitlock, who was the starter most of last season, returns at QB in the Knights' new spread offense. Senior RB Braedon Robertson, coming off a big 2023 season, is also back along with speedy slotback J'Kobe Lawson. Other returning starters are senior WR Marvaion White, junior OL Hudson Smith, senior OL Sam Morgan and senior OL Hunter Evans.

Defense: The Knights will be strong at linebacker with the return of first-team All-District selections Ja'Myrian Jackson and Ke'Maurion Jefferson, both juniors, and second-team selection Jeremiah Washington, a sophomore. Senior S Cam Lewis, senior rover Jasavion Miller and senior DL Braylon Richardson we're all second-team All-District selections last season. CB J'Kobe Lawson also returns.

Overall: The Knights have the potential for another outstanding season. A lot will depend on how the offense adapts to Wilson's new system. Both J'Kobe Lawson and Braedon Robertson are capable of making big plays. The defense could be the team's strength with eight returning starters. Offense: Redshirt junior Garrett Nussmeier takes the reins at QB after the departure of Heisman Trophy winner Jayden Daniels to the NFL. 2023 star WRs Malik Nabers and Brian Thomas Jr. are also in the NFL now, but the Tigers remain deep at the position with fifth-year senior Kyren Lacy and RS junior Chris Hilton Jr. leading the way. TE Mason Taylor also returns. Nussmeier will be protected by one of the best lines in the country with returning starters Will Campbell, Emery Jones, Garrett Dillinger and Miles Frazier. Sophomore RB Kaleb Jackson could have a breakout season. Graduate students Josh Williams and John Emery Jr. will also be in the mix.

Defense: Blake Baker has Itaken over at coordinator after Matt House was let go following last season's struggles. Junior Harold Perkins Jr. returns to inside LB, the position he played as a star freshman. Senior Greg Penn III also returns at the position. Senior S Major Burns leads the secondary. The line is a big question mark. Fifth-year senior Jacobian Guillory and 6-6 senior DE Sai'vion Jones will be counted on to be impact players, per Athlon Sports.

Overall: If the Tigers are going to contend for an SEC championship much less a national one the defense must improve. Last year, the Tigers allowed 31.5 points per game in SEC play. Scouting report

Offense: Eric Dooley, a former GSU player and head coach at Southern and Prairie View A&M, is the new coordinator/QB coach. The Tigers will be looking for another big year from redshirt senior QB Myles Crawley, the SWAC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year. He will again have sophomore Javon Robinson, the 2023 SWAC Freshman of the Year, at WR. With the top two rushers from last season gone, the Tigers expect transfers Jaden Handy (Ole Miss) and Ke'Travion Hargrove (Memphis) to fill the position. Junior OL Tahj Martin is one of the best in the conference at his position.

Defense: Jason Rollins is the new coordinator. He was the interim head coach at Southern in 2021 and served two seasons as DC at UTSA before that. Redshirt junior DE Isaac Washington and sophomore transfer DB Eric Randall (Louisiana Tech) had solid performances in the weather-shortened spring game. The Tigers lost their top two tacklers from last season. Junior DB Kevin Thomas, who ranked third with 29 tackles, is back. Also returning are RS senior DB Quintin Talley and senior LB Josh

Outlook: New Head Coach Mickey Joseph takes over a team that should contend not only for the SWAC West title but also for the overall crown. Last year, the Tigers lost three games by five points or less. QB Myles Crawley has already shown what he can do. Last year, the Tigers averaged 28.7 points per game and allowed 28.6. The former number

Offense: Redshirt junior Jack Turner takes the reins at QB. He saw plenty of playing time last season subbing for injured Hank Bachmeier. RB Marquis Crosby is back after missing all of last season except one play with an injury. As a redshirt freshman in 2022, he rushed for 918 yards. With All-CUSA WR and return specialist Smoke Harris gone, a bevy of receivers have the potential to see playing time including junior Solo Lewis, redshirt senior Demarcus Griffin-Taylor, sophomore Dedrick Latulas, redshirt sophomore Marlion Jackson and Bowling Green transfer Abdul Fatai-Ibrahim, a redshirt senior. Griffin-Taylor takes over as return

specialist. 6-5, 348-pound Bert Hale is back on the line

Defense: Jeremiah Johnson takes over as the coordinator, bringing an impressive resume with him. His defense is expected to allow players to have more freedom to make plays within multiple schemes. CB Michael Richard, the 2023 CUSA Freshman of the Year, is back along with senior DE Jessie Evans, redshirt junior Kolbe Fields and graduate student DL Mykol Clark. Transfer safeties Blake Thompson and Jordyn Morgan could also be impact players, per Athlon Sports. LB CJ Harris, a Kent State transfer, is another key addition.

Overall: The Bulldogs are coming off 3-9 seasons in Cumbie's first two seasons as head coach. Last season could have been much better as Tech lost four games by eight points or less. Five came down to the final possession. New coordinator Jeremiah Johnson will look to turn around a defense that

Scouting report

Offense: The Demons will have a new look under McCorkle and new coordinator/QB coach Norman Joseph, who has developed a reputation as a playcalling innovator and developer of guarterbacks. Three QBs — senior Quaterius Hawkins, redshirt freshman JT Fayard and sophomore Kekahi Brown spent time at QB in the spring. Senior Chance Newman could play a variety of positions, including QB. During the summer, NSU added two transfer WRs — 6-3 John Barr and 6-5 Billy Finley. RB Kennieth Lacy returns.

Defense: The defense turned in strong performances in spring scrimmages under new coordinator Matt Connor and could be the team's strength early in the season. Junior LB Cadillac Rhone leads the returning players. During the summer, NSU added three transfer linemen — Atravon Bossier, Cam George and Tyler Lewis — who will add depth. Former Parkway star LB Connor Norcross, a junior, had a solid spring. Redshirt freshman DE Chancellor Owens performed well in the spring. Junior CB Caesar Magee III and junior S Cam Hardy had interceptions in an early fall scrimmage.

Overall: After going 0-6 in last year's shortened season and a change at head coach, there are obviously more questions than answers going into the 2024 season. The Demons will have new looks on both sides of the ball. Depth could be an issue but offseason transfers will help. McCorkle had a lot of success at Belhaven and there's no reason to


